(You could not spell *are* because the *r* comes after the *e* in the spelling word.)

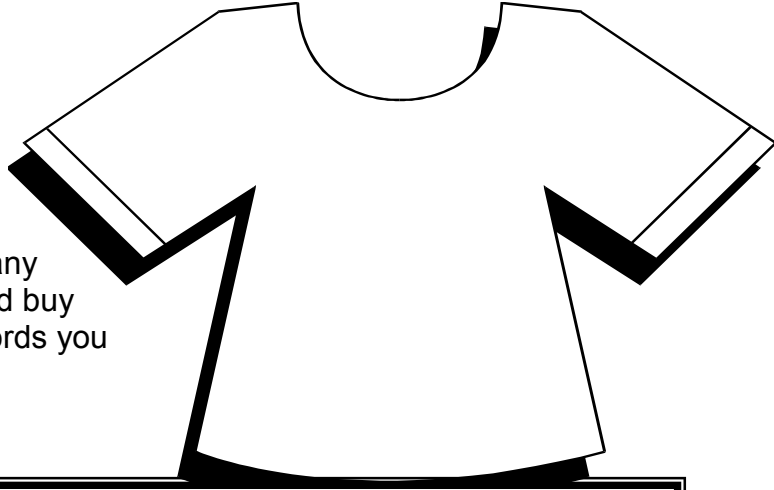

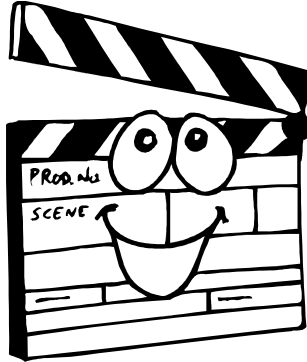
Movie Titles

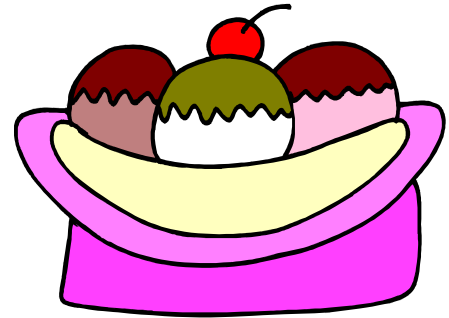
Banana Splits

Here's a yummy way to practice spelling words!

Object of the game: Be the first player to finish coloring a banana split

Supplies: Game boards, crayons, 30 or more spelling words written on separate cards

Preparation: Shuffle the word cards and place them face down on the table.



To Play:

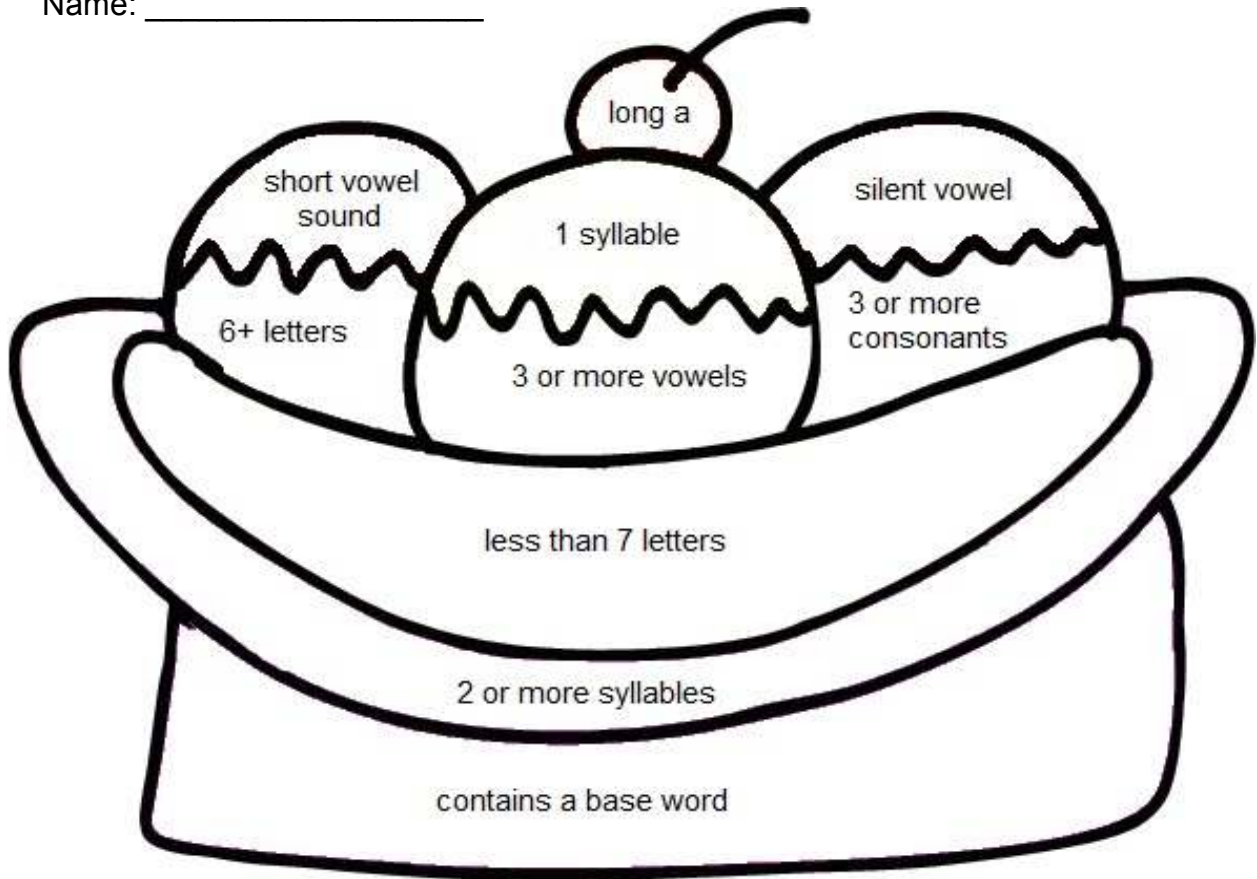
1. Each player chooses a game board and writes his name on it. (Both players may use copies of the same game boards or play with different ones.)
2. Player 1 draws the top word card and reads it aloud. Player 2 spells the word. If she spells it correctly, she writes it in the box under "Correct." Then she finds a space on her game card that describes the word and colors it in. If she spells the word incorrectly, she writes it under "Incorrect," and her turn is over.
3. Players take turns drawing cards and spelling words until a player has colored her entire banana split.
4. If a player spells a word correctly, but has no spaces left to color that describe that word, she spells a second word. If there is still no space left to color, that player's turn is over.
5. The game ends when one player has colored her entire banana split. That person is the winner of the game.

Use new game boards and new spelling words to play over and over again!

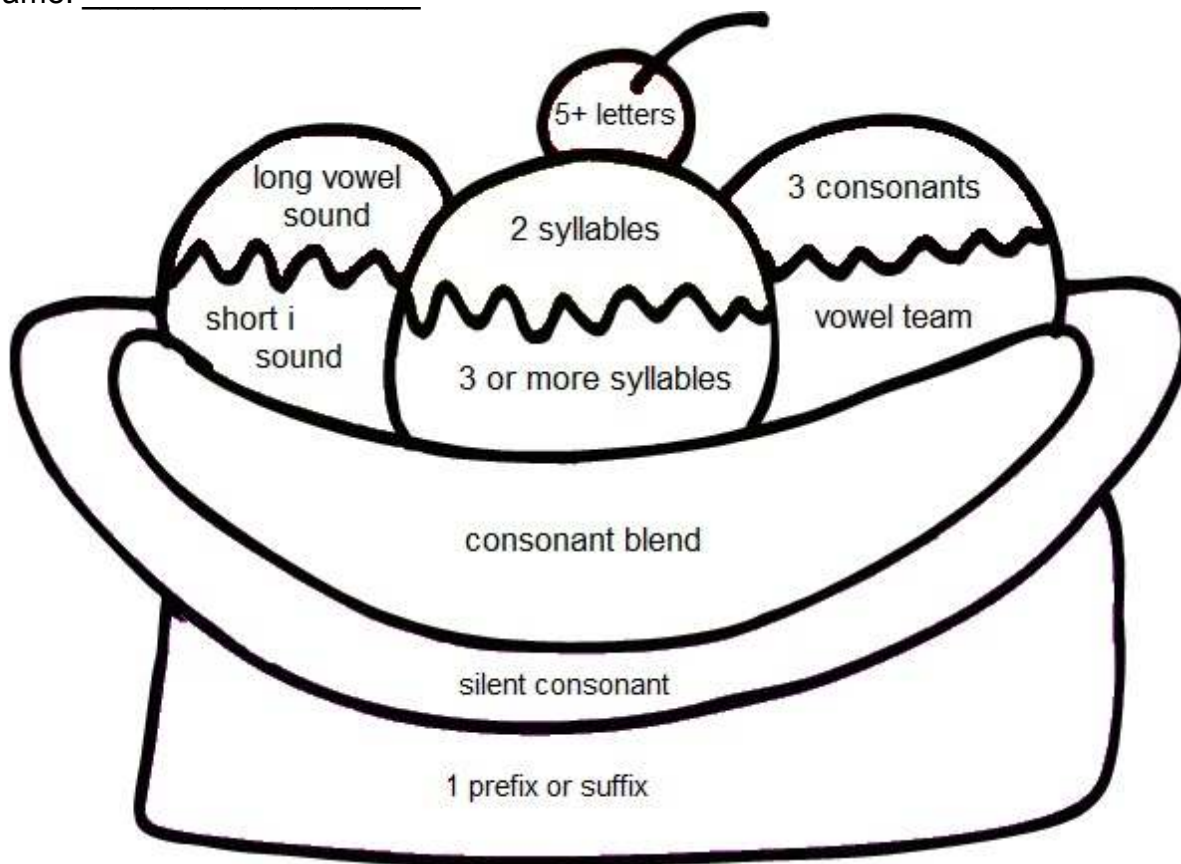

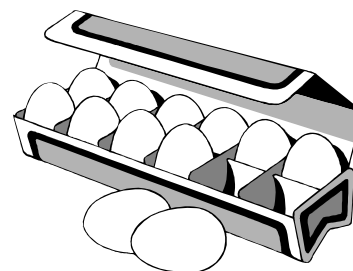

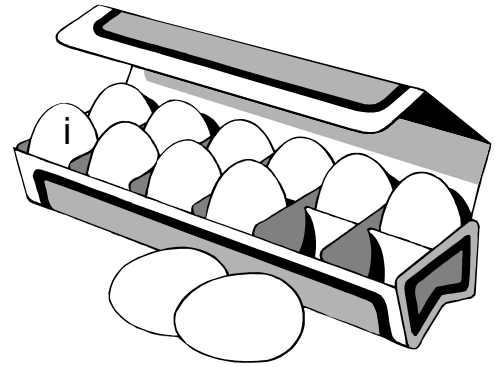
