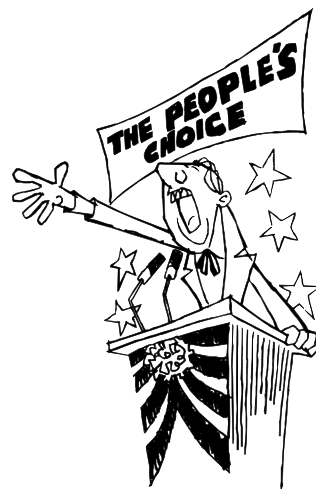


## Cast Your Vote!
